ADVANCED CARDIAC LIFE SUPPORT 1-Day Renewal Course

FEE: \$150

Designed for the experienced provider, this is a fast-paced course covering sudden cardiac arrest and other cardiac emergencies, utilizing case-based scenarios. Learners must already have ACLS Provider card and complete an online pretest in advance. All participants must complete an ACLS online Precourse Self-Assessment, score a 70% or above, print the results from the same computer, and bring the printout to class. Failure to do so will require rescheduling the face-to-face class on a different day.

PEDIATRIC ADVANCED CARDIAC LIFE SUPPORT 1-Day Renewal Course

FEE: \$150

This is a 1-day AHA refresher course for those with a current PALS provider card. The video-based, instructor-led course uses a series of simulated pediatric emergencies to reinforce the important concepts of a systematic approach to pediatric assessment, basic life support, PALS treatment algorithms, effective resuscitation and team dynamics. All participants must complete an ACLS online Precourse Self-Assessment, score a 70% or above, print the results from the same computer, and bring the printout to class. Failure to do so will require rescheduling the face-to-face class on a different day.

ADVANCED STROKE LIFE SUPPORT® 1-Day Provider & 1-Day Instructor Courses - 11th edition

FEES Prehospital: \$175 Provider Course / \$200 Instructor Course / \$300 for both

FEES Hospital-based: \$200 Provider Course / \$225 Instructor Course / \$350 for both

The provider course addresses the prehospital, emergency department, and stroke unit management of patients with acute stroke. Using interactive discussions, hands-on workshops, multimedia and standardized patients, the course includes rapid recognition of five major stroke syndromes and use of a focused neurologic evaluation to identify stroke, its location, severity, and thrombolytic therapy considerations in acute ischemic stroke patients. Those wishing to become ASLS® instructors must complete both a provider (scoring 84% or higher) and instructor course, be aligned with a registered ASLS® training center, and submit for the ASLS® Instructor Registry.

REGISTRATION:

All live classes take place at the Gordon Center for Research in Medical Education, 1120 N.W. 14 St., first floor, from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., unless indicated otherwise. Our Florida Board of Nursing Provider Number is FBN 50-329. Our CAPCE provider number is UMIA0005. The Gordon Center is also accredited as a provider of continuing nursing education by the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) Commission on Accreditation.

Classes are subject to cancellation or rescheduling if minimum registration is not achieved.

Fees: Course materials are included, unless otherwise noted. With the exception of the web courses for Florida responders, prepayment of tuition or prior arrangement for departmental billing is required. MasterCard, Visa, American Express and Discover Card, and checks are accepted (not cash). AHA course materials should be picked up in advance; shipping charges are additional.

Refunds: Refunds or credit for future classes will only be issued with notification of withdrawal at least two days prior to the date of class. Requests for refund must be in writing, include the reason for withdrawal and be received no later than 30 days following withdrawal. Tuition will be refunded minus 15% for administrative costs plus the cost of any course materials provided. Should a class be cancelled or rescheduled, the course fee is refundable in full upon request.
